<p>Spring 2 – Time: People and Places from the past</p>	<p><u>Understanding the World</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Comment on images of familiar situations in the past - Compare and contrast characters from stories, including figures from the past - Draw information from a simple map 	<p><u>Pre-Geography</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Britain is a group of three countries: England, Scotland and Wales. - Chesterton (where we go to school) is in England. - Castles have thick wall made from stones and rocks found around them. - Many castles were built on a hill and near to the sea or water. <p><u>Pre-History</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The past has already happened. - A castle is a large, old building with tall, thick walls. - People in the castle had lots of different jobs. 	<p><u>Pre-Geography</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Looking at Britain on a map - Countries in Britain - Maps of castles - Compare castles <p><u>Pre-History</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Features of a castle - Purpose of a castle - Life in a castle

<p>Summer 1 – Changing and Growing: Plants and Animals</p>	<p><u>Understanding the World</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Explore the natural world around them - Describe what they see, hear and feel whilst outside 	<p><u>Pre-Science</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Change is when something becomes different. - Growing is when something gets greater over time. - Plants grow from a seed or a bulb. - Plants and animals are living things. They breathe. - Lots of new things grow in the spring and summer. - The sun and water (rain) help plants to grow. - A habitat is a place where something lives. - Minibeasts are small animals without bones inside their bodies. - Insects have six legs and one or more wings. - Insects and spiders are minibeasts. - Some baby animals look like their parents. Some do not. - A hen comes from an egg. - A chick is the name for a baby hen. 	<p><u>Pre-Science</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Growing seeds and plants: planting, growing, dying - Butterflies and moths: metamorphosis (changing)

Understanding the World

- Recognise some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries.
- Recognise some environments that are different from the one in which they live.

Pre-Science

- A habitat is a place where something lives.
- Some animals live in the wild. This means they can take care of themselves.
- Some large animals live in different countries.
- Nature and Natural means things that are not made by people
- Seas and oceans are salt water.
- Water covers most of the Earth.
- Land is the part of the Earth not covered by water.
- Floating is when something sits on top of the water on its own.
- Sinking is when something goes under the water on its own

Pre-Geography

- England is a country.
- There are lots of different countries in the world.
- Some countries have differences to England. Some have similarities.
- Some places (environments) are different to the one I live in.

Pre-Science

- Floating and sinking

Pre-Geography

- Places in the world that contrast with locations they know well
- How other children travel to school
- What other children eat
- Where other children live
(Avoid stereotyping)
- Contrasting environments within both their local and national region
(seaside, countryside, town)
- British wildlife
- Specific features of the world both natural and made by people
- Comparing cold and warm places: desert, arctic, rainforests
