- Europe is a continent. It is located above the equator.
- The equator is an invisible line around the middle of the Earth.
- Population is the number of people that live together in the same place.
- A sea is an area of water that is smaller than an ocean.
- An ocean is a large area of water between continents.
- A continent is a group of countries.
- Many countries in Europe join each other.
- A land locked country means it is surrounded by other countries and not seas or oceans.
- A compass shows a direction. There are eight main points of a compass.



- Maps are not to the exact size of land.
- A landmark is a place or an object that is easily seen or known.
