Year 6 – The Changing Power of Monarchs: The Georgians 1714 – c.1837

Crucial Knowledge

- The Georgians were the royal family from 1714 – 1837
- It is called The Georgian era because most of the monarchs during this time were called King George.
- Lots of changes in society in Britain happened during this time; workhouses were set-up, poor men were allowed to vote and slavery was banned.
- Robert Walpole was the first Prime Minister (PM) of Britain (1721). He was the PM for 21 years and was given 10 Downing Street to live and work in.
- Robert Peel founded The Metropolitan Police (1829) – the first ever police force in Britain.
- In 1801 the Act of Union created the Union Flag (Union Jack).
- Before this time the King or Queen would have power over the country.
