Crucial Knowledge

- This time (1837 – 1901) is named after Queen Victoria (who is the Great, great grandma of our Queen now).
- The workhouse was a place to live for people who didn't have enough money to look after themselves.
- At first, only rich children received an education so most children went to work.
- New laws were introduced and eventually children went to school but it was very strict.
- Florence Nightingale was a nurse who brought changes to how people in hospitals were treated, mainly through being clean and caring for others.
- Lots of developments to work, homes, machinery and medicine happened during this time.
- Alexander Graham Bell invented the first telephone.
