Crucial Knowledge

- The Great Fire of London was a huge fire in London.
- It started in Pudding Lane on the 2nd September 1666.
- The fire spread so quickly because houses were close together. Most houses were made from thatch (straw) and there wasn't a fire brigade (service). Note: straw catches and spreads fire quicker than bricks or wood.
- Samuel Pepys was a man who watched the fire and wrote a diary about what he saw.
- King Charles II was the King of England at the time of the fire.
