Crucial Knowledge

- Living things can be plants or animals.
- A living thing is something that breathes <u>and</u> grows.
- Dead is when something used to breathe and grow but no longer does.
- A habitat is a home that gives food and shelter.
 (Example, the habitat of a blackbird is a tree and the space around it).
- Habitats are different because animals and plants are different.
- A food chain is how plants and animals get their energy.
- Animals get their energy from food. Plants get their energy from light (sun).
